2020 Sailing Season At Galway City Sailing Club

Sailing by its nature and our club in particular, due to the class of boats we sail, was fortunate to be one of the first activities that could resume when Covid 19 lockdown restrictions were eased in late spring. As restrictions eased over the summer we adjusted our activities accordingly to offer as much sailing as possible in a safe and friendly environment. Indeed we went further than that and pushed to hold **our first ever national event** with **sailors from all corners of Ireland** participating in our **West Coast Topper Traveller**.

Other highlights of 2020 included our restructured Junior Summer Sailing Programme, our participation in and the organisation of the Annual Cong Galway Sailing Race, Summer & Autumn Race Series, Junior Coaching Programme and our Annual Junior Regatta. This year saw much welcome infrastructure & capability improvements with the building of a new ramp onto the beach and the use of our tractor for easier Rib launch and retrieval. Additionally plans are at an advanced stage to sign the license for our new dinghy park which will be located closer to the beach.

While not a typical sailing season, against the odds, 2020 was filled with sailing, events and improvements. I would like to thank our **members**, **parents**, **sailing instructors**, **volunteers** and **supporters** for making all this happen.

2020 was a **successful end to our first ten years of sailing in the city** and a great platform for our **10 year anniversary, 2021**.

To **celebrate our 10 Years Of Sailing In The City** we have updated our **Club Logo** and plan to run a programme of commemorative events over the 2021 season.

2020 Season Highlights

Junior Coaching & Sailing



Junior sailing started in January with recent additions to the Topper Fleet enjoying their first outing. While events led to a cancelling of all sailing early in the year, once it was feasible to sail again our Juniors were back on the water for Coaching, General Sailing Sessions and active participation in our races series in all weathers.

Infrastructure & Capacity Improvements





Our tractor was a real step forward in 2020, negating the use of personal vehicles and ensuring we can launch RIBs regardless of conditions on the slip and the tide height.

The new ramp onto the beach is a very welcome addition making it easier to access the beach and more importantly for tired sailors to retrieve their boats at the end of a sailing session.

Junior Sailing Courses - Thanks To Instructors & Assistants



Summer saw the return of our popular Junior Summer Courses which sold out again in 2020. Martin Roe, Sharon De Bhaldraithe and the junior committee reorganised the format of the courses to take account of Covid-19 safety requirements. This saw separate courses run during the morning and afternoon sessions. The format worked so well that it may form the basis of how we run these courses in the future. Our instructors were Conor Sheriff, Rian De Bairead & Rob Talbot ably assisted by Colm O' Fatharta, Alex Roe & Beibhinn De Bhaldraithe.

The feedback from participants and parents was excellent. Parents were impressed with how much their children could do after a

week of sailing and how their child's confidence on the water grew every day, and the kids, well, they just had great fun!
